# TRACKER DOGS UNIT INFORMATION




One of Mugie's aces is the Tracker Dog Unit. The unit consists of two bloodhounds and their four handlers. The unit supports the protection of wildlife in Mugie and follows up on stock thefts, cases of missing people, and other petty incidents in the neighboring communities.

The K-9 Unit is based at Bravo 5, in the heart of Mugie. When not out in the field following up on incidents, the dogs undergo daily training and patrols with Sundays being their rest and grooming day.

The K-9 Unit has had a huge impact on Mugie, with wildlife related crimes in the Conservancy dropping to practically zero. In addition to following up on incidents, the simple presence of the K-9 Unit works as a strong deterrent for all those with ill intentions.

In regards to activities in the communities, the impact of the Unit is significant. Years of operations and recovery of thousands of stolen stock and the arrest of several criminals, has created a general trust towards Mugie's Security team, boosting community collaboration and reducing petty incidents.
