



REPORT FOR THE OUTREACH CONDUCTED AT LOGORATEHEALTH CENTRE ON JULY 3rd, 2024.

Introduction

On July 3, 2024, we successfully carried out a medical outreach at Logorate Community Health Centre in Samburu County. This initiative was a joint effort between our team from Mugie Conservancy and its stakeholders. Our main goal was to offer essential healthcare services to the residents of Logorate, address their medical needs, promote overall wellness, and maintain a positive relationship with the community.

Objectives:

The outreach event had an impressive turnout, with **158 residents** attending. Our team provided a variety of essential services with care and professionalism. The highlights included:

- General consultations and free medications administered based on patients' diagnoses.
- Wound management.
- Immunizations for **24 children**, as it was the scheduled immunization day for the health centre.
- ANC services and counseling provided to 7 mothers.
- No referral cases.








Patients Report

Above 5 years: **185 patients** were seen over the age of 5 years. Below is a pie chart that gives a picture of what was managed. No referral was made.




Over 5 years at Logorate, July 3,2024.
