

REPORT FOR A MEDICAL OUTREACH CONDUCTED AT KANAMBIO COMMUNITY ON FEBRUARY 18, 2025.

Introduction

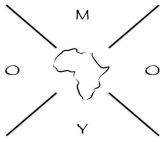
On **18th February 2025**, our team conducted a medical outreach at **Kanambio Community**, providing essential healthcare services to residents who often face barriers to medical access. This initiative aimed to improve community health by offering direct medical interventions, health education and community engagement activities. A total of **157 residents** received medical attention, including **64 males and 93 females**. Additionally, we extended our impact to Kanambio ECDE pupils, incorporating a deworming program and a sanitation awareness campaign to promote long-term health benefits among children.

Highlights:

1. School Outreach:

- Recognizing the importance of child health, we initiated a deworming program at Kanambio ECDE, where 100 young pupils received dewormers. In addition to the medication, an educational session was conducted on sanitation and hygiene, equipping the children with knowledge on how to maintain cleanliness and prevent infections.

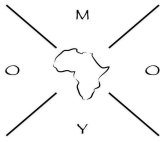




2. Environmental Clean-Up with Teachers and Pupils

- As we waited for the community members to attend the outreach, we took the opportunity to engage the pupils in a meaningful way. Together with their teachers, we led a school-wide environmental cleanup, collecting litter and promoting a culture of cleanliness within the school compound. We also organized fun activities, creating a warm and friendly atmosphere that encouraged learning, interaction and community spirit.

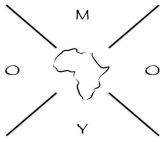




3. Medical Outreach & Healthcare Services Provided

- The core focus of the outreach was attending to the medical needs of the community. A total of **157 residents** benefited from the following healthcare services:
 - General consultations to diagnose and manage common illnesses.
 - Blood pressure monitoring to assess and manage hypertension risks.
 - Administration of essential drugs to treat identified medical conditions.

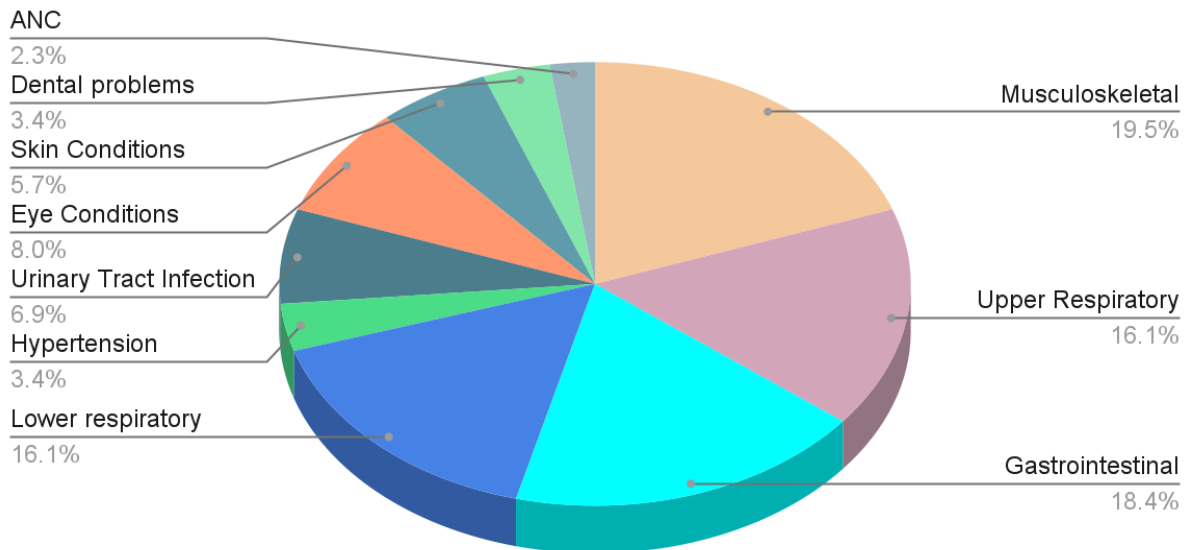




Patients Report

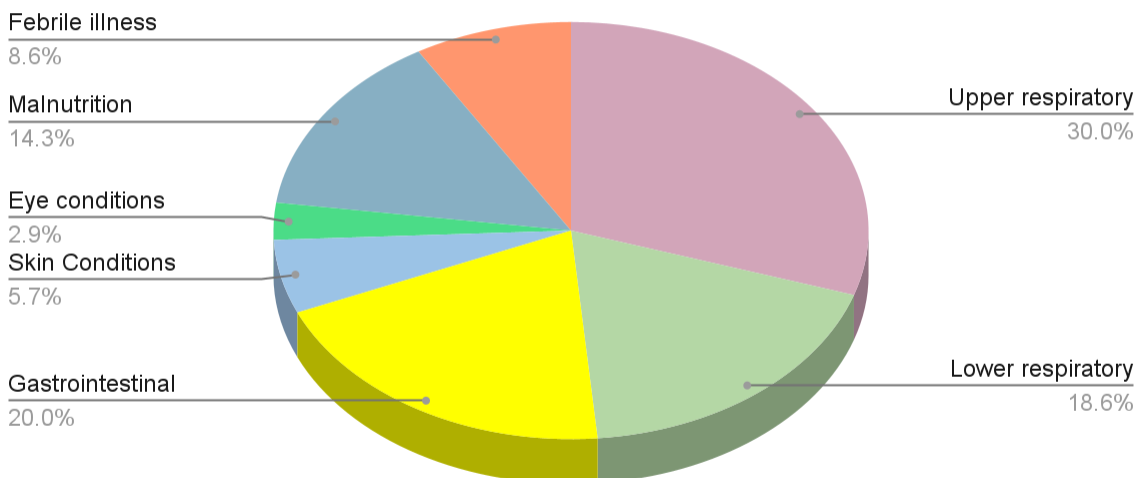
Above 5 years: 87 were seen over the age of 5 years. Below is a pie chart that gives a picture of what was managed. No referral was made.

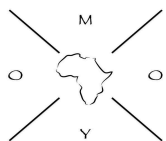
Kanampio Medical Outreach (Over 5 Years)

Kanampio Medical Outreach(Under 5 years)



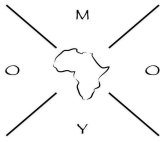


Costs Incurred
